Nevada Promise Scholarship

The Nevada Promise Scholarship is a unique scholarship established by the Nevada Legislature for Nevada high school graduates to attend community college. As a last-dollar scholarship, the Nevada Promise Scholarship can cover **up to three years of tuition** and other mandatory fees not covered by other gift aid. Students must apply during the application period (August through October), and keep current on the ongoing application steps.

Adapting to Online Learning Tips

1. Instead of working on all subjects every day, break up your classes to work on one or two subjects a day. (Divide your time to 2.5 hours per subject).
2. Take breaks or mental health time for food and rest. Work a.m., afternoon, and/or p.m. (Break your day up).
3. On days you have p.m. live lessons, a suggestion is to start later so that you're not working 6 hours and then putting in time in your p.m. session(s) as well.
4. You can create a flexible schedule so you are not in front of a computer for hours. Change it up and look at pacing instead of hours. Make a list of what is due by Friday each week and then make a schedule. It may differ from week to week.
5. Teachers have office hours for one-on-one appointments. If you have questions, even if it is just how to work on certain assignments, please reach out to your teacher. Advocate and ask so you get the information to help you pass your classes.

3. Turn in an assignment for the class


Or
